




WQHA Hall of Fame Inductee



CAU She Wrote 1973 (TB) Bay Stallion





All She Wrote was a 17 hand bay Thoroughbred Stallion, foaled in 1973. He was purchased by George & Lynne Herides for the purpose of creating an Appendix horse that would have the mind of a quarter horse and the movement of a thoroughbred. As a result, he made a major impact on the AQHA breed, as well as hunter jumpers, dressage horses, color breeds as well as driving horses. His history is well known in the Quarter Horse industry with his offspring having earned thousands of AQHA points.

He was purchased in the late 1970's as a result of a phone call from a Thoroughbred farm in Illinois that shipped a stallion from Florida. He was raced as a stakes and allowance horse, and had broken his sesmoid bone. Lynne and George had to make a decision right away as he was to be destroyed since he would not race again. He had great bloodlines going back to Native Dancer, so in the middle of the night and with a borrowed single horse trailer, they set out to see him. After being examined by veterinarians, they were told it would be a miracle if ever walked again much less be used as a breeding stallion. Thankfully, he proved them wrong and the rest is history! He was handsome, great conformation, extremely strong hindquarters and a very beautiful and intelligent head. He went on to sire 125 foals in 19 foal crops that earned 1,285 AQHA points in performance and halter events and \$17,206.31 in AQHA Incentive Fund Earnings. Offspring earned over \$11,000 in National Snaffle Bit Association winnings as well. One of All She Wrote's well know offspring was WQHA HOF Gypsy Loom who was one of the leading broodmares in the AQHA.

- Exhibitor must be a current WQHA member PRIOR TO THE SHOW DATE
- Tiny Tot or member of his/her immediate family must be a WQHA member. Tiny Tots must be age 10 or under as of January 1st of the current year. All participants receive an award. A Tiny Tot exhibitor is not eligible to enter any other division.
- An annual nomination fee of \$25.00 per division plus registration copy must accompany the initial point form. This is in addition to WQHA Membership. Make checks out to WQHA.
- Points/placings are per horse/exhibitor team.
- Points carry over from year to year for the Merit and Champion divisions; however, all point forms must be received by the Open Show Coordinator within 30 days of the show date or they will NOT be counted.
- Points accumulated as a Tiny Tot will transfer to Youth. Points accumulated as Youth will transfer to Adult.
- The show year begins October 15th and ends on October 14th of current year. All point forms must be in by October 20th or they will NOT count.



2016 WQHA Show and Contest Rules

WQHA SHOW APPROVAL REQUIREMENTS

1. It is understood that all shows requesting approval of the Wisconsin Quarter Horse Association must be approved by the American Quarter Horse Association. However, a show may apply for WQHA approval before receiving AQHA approval by marking the show application "AQHA approval pending." (NOTE: In order to obtain AQHA approval, an "Application for Approval" form, properly completed, shall be forwarded to the Secretary of the AQHA Association at least ninety (90) days prior to the first date of the proposed show or contest. Such blank forms and other information may be obtained from the American Quarter Horse Association, Amarillo, Texas 79168).

2. Applications for show approval must be filed with the Show Coordinator by March 1 of the approval year. Applications can consist of either oral or written intentions to hold said shows. Every show must send a representative to the Show Coordination seminar that is held before the start of the show season, or at the discretion of the WQHA board, the shows may be refused approval. All WQHA approved shows will use the approved computer program and back number system. The WQHA will have a 55show limit for approvals and will limit and discourage the approval of shows being held on weekdays. No current year shows will be held after the last weekend in October. WQHA approved shows may either obtain insurance thru the WQHA insurance provider, or if they choose to use a different carrier provide the WQHA with a Certificate of Liability Insurance. 3. Two complete show program flyers for printing in the Newsletter should also be mailed to the WQHA Newsletter Coordinator by February published due date. If not received by

then, neither the Newsletter Editor, nor the WQHA can be held responsible if the show information does not reach the exhibitors on time. Show management agrees to pay the Newsletters fee for printing a flyer, payment must accompany flyer. Shows run on consecutive days with identical show programs may submit one flyer only and will be charged for printing just one flyer. This does not apply to the same management running shows on different weekends throughout the year.

4. No show will start later than 15 minutes after published starting time. If the starting time is more than 15 minutes later without a valid reason, as determined by the WQHA Board of Directors, show approval for the following year may be withheld.
5. At a show there is to be no longeing in the designated show area and make up arena during show hours, this includes all breaks. Show management may make changes because of weather.

6. At a show there is to be no ponying of horses in the designated show area or makeup arena during show hours, this includes all breaks.

7. If working hunter classes are offered at a show, a scheduled practice time for working hunters only will be provided. No riders on the flat or longeing will be allowed in the pen during this time. There will be no jumping practice during open practice sessions when the pen is open for riders on the flat and people longeing. 8. If pleasure driving is offered at the show, a scheduled warm-up and practice time will be made available for driving horses only. No riders or longeing will be allowed in the arena or pen during the pleasure driving warm-up.

9. All exhibitors and horses must be clear of arenas and pens before tractors and arena maintenance equipment can proceed with work.

10. There is no required order for halter classes.

11. All WQHA required classes and optional classes selected must be judged, laid out and operated in accordance with WQHA requirements. The AQHA approved classes must be run according to the rules set forth in the latest edition of the Show and Contest Rules and **Regulations of the American Quarter** Horse Association. All classes must be on the published show bill to be recognized for WQHA year end points. All AQHA approved classes are eligible as point classes for yearend WQHA awards, providing they are offered under 12 judges.

12. Each WQHA approved horse show will submit a fee in the amount of \$1.00 (one dollar) per horse show entry to the WQHA, payable within 15 days of the end of the show. This fee is incorporated into the WQHA yearend awards program.

Show results and fees received after the 15 day limit but before the 30 days will result in the forfeiture of show date preference for the following year. Failure to forward show results and fees after 30 days will result in not approving the show in succeeding years, at the discretion of the Board of Directors. Shows found in violation of this rule will be granted approval only with the estimated total \$1.00 fee paid in advance by March 1 of the approval year. An estimate will be derived from an average of previous year's charges. 14. Sale dates reserved with the WQHA will require a \$25.00 nonrefundable fee, payable to the WQHA and forwarded to the Show Coordinator. A full page ad regarding the sale must be published in the Newsletter in order that the date be reserved by the WQHA. Sale Management agrees to pay the Newsletter fee for the full-page ad. No WQHA approved show will be run

to conflict with a sale date reserved in this manner.

15. No more than one show or sale will be approved for one date by the WQHA. WQHA shows and sales approved the previous year will have priority over other shows applying for approval, provided they met all WQHA rules the previous year and meet the current show approval policies of the WQHA.

16. It is suggested that judges be from out of state. It is recommended that judges not be from a neighboring state. It is also required that they judge no more than one Wisconsin show per year. In the event of a show emergency, this rule may be waived to accommodate substitute judges. **17.** All shows requesting approval must do so with the Show Coordinator by March 1 of the approval year; shows requested after March 1 of the approval year will be considered for the following year's approval with no exceptions. The show calendar will be prepared for publication in the Spring Newsletter. 18. Hardship Clause: Because in any given situation there might arise extenuating circumstances which might be cause to except one or more of these rules in order to grant approval of a show, the committee reserves the right to do so in cases that do not in any manner conflict with the purposes, policies and intent of the WQHA.

19. Suggestions for show grounds, facilities, and class schedules are supplied in the AQHA Show Manager's Guide. New shows applying for WQHA approval may be subject to inspection of same, prior to final approval. Inspection will be conducted by a person(s) appointed by the WQHA Show Coordination Committee.

20. Halter Classes are point classes for year-end WQHA awards, providing

they are offered under 12 judges at approved shows.

21. Performance Classes are point classes for year-end WQHA awards, providing they are offered under 12 judges at approved shows. At the option of each show and where allowed by AQHA rules performance classes may be offered as Junior and Senior divisions, and will be considered for WQHA points, provided they are offered as JR/ SR in not less than 12 of the approved shows.

21A. Amateur Performance Classes are point classes for yearend WQHA awards, providing they are offered under 12 judges at approved shows. At show management's option, any number of classes from the full slate of Amateur performance classes may also be offered as Amateur Select ages 50 and over. Management will combine these classes back to an allage class should there be fewer than 3 entries in the Amateur Select or Amateur Class. In the event a class offered on the show bill as amateur select and amateur are combined at the show, WQHA points will be awarded to the respective age group. Jumping and Team Penning may only be offered as all-age classes. Any of the Amateur Performance AQHA approved classes may also be offered at the show managements discretion in the Amateur Select, Novice Amateur and Rookie divisions. The WQHA suggests shows offer classes in these divisions. In the Amateur Halter events, shows may offer the halter classes as Yearlings, 2 year olds, 3 year olds, Aged, and Performance. In the Amateur Division, halter classes will be offered for Stallions, Mares, and Geldings. 22. Youth Activity Performance Classes are point classes for year-end WQHA awards, providing they are

offered under 12 judges at approved shows.

Any of the Youth Performance AQHA approved classes may also be offered at the show managements discretion in the Novice Youth and Rookie divisions. The WQHA suggests shows offer classes in these divisions. In the Youth Halter events, shows may offer the halter classes as Yearlings, 2 year olds, 3 year olds, Aged, and Performance. In the Youth Division, halter classes will be offered for Mares, and Geldings.

23. Age group limits in Youth Activity events may be set by the show management. In no case, however, shall any contestant be more than 18 years of age. For horse show purposes, the age of an individual on January 1 of that year shall be maintained throughout the entire year. (Example: A youngster who has a birthday in July and is 18 years of age on January 1, 2015 may show throughout the entire year of 2015 as an 18 year old). Youth classes may be offered as 18 & under, or 13 & under and 14 -18.

24. SMALL FRY 10 and Under: The following listed Small Fry classes are suggested classes. All the listed classes are approved for year end WQHA awards providing they are held in not less than 12 of the approved shows.

a. Small Fry Showmanship b. Small Fry Trail c. Small Fry Western Pleasure d. Small Fry Western Horsemanship e. Small Fry Hunter Under Saddle

f. Small Fry Equitation

The WQHA suggests shows offer classes in the Small Fry division. Rules of ownership for the Small Fry division are the same as any other youth showing in the AQHA approved youth

classes to earn a Grand or Reserve WQHA yea end award. Riders may also show in AQHA halter or showmanship classes, but not any class in which the canter or lope is required. Riders must show to a minimum of 12 judges to be eligible for a Grand or Reserve year end award. Other riders may ride for a participation award.

25. Lead Line ages 7 and under: Lead line riders must participate in a minimum of three shows and earn a minimum of 5 points to receive a participation award. Riders must control the horse at the walk, and back if asked. Handlers are there for safety, lead line handlers should be 18 years of age or older. Halters should be placed under the bridle, handlers are expected to maintain control of their horses at all times. Riders are not required to own their mount to qualify for participation awards. This is not a WQHA approved classawards are presented if an individual or, group is willing to defray the cost. Entries are submitted per show(s) i.e. single, split combined, or multiple judged. Exhibitors have the option to enter all of their classes for the circuit in advance. Entries are to be made at the show office or in some instances pre-entries via the internet may be offered. All scratches must be made at the show office. Failure to scratch at the show office prior to the start of a class will make the exhibitor liable for the entry fee(s). ELIGIBILITY FOR WQHA POINTS AND AWARDS: In order to be eligible to acquire WQHA points, monies or awards, both the owner and exhibitor must be members in good standing of the Association. POINTS: All members and exhibitors regardless of residence location are eligible to receive points for the year-end awards. In order for a horse to earn said points, all parties listed as owner on the Certificate of

Registration must be members of the WQHA. The points for WQHA shows held after the last weekend in October through December will count toward year-end awards in the following year.

WQHA points will be awarded in each of the listed classes on the following basis:

One point extra in each place, for each five extra horses. The Grand Champion of each sex division will receive at least one point more than any other horse in its sex division. If necessary, additional points will be added to the points the Grand Champion won in its age class to give it this total. The Reserve Champion of each sex division will receive as many points as any horse in its sex division except the Grand Champion. If necessary, additional points will be added to the points the Reserve Champion won in its age class to give it this total.

YEAR-END AWARDS

Year-end awards are to be presented to the high point horse in each registered performance and halter class with a suitable award to the second (reserve) high point in each registered class, provided the horse or rider have shown to 12 judges. Yearend awards are to be presented to the high point youth and novice youth and a suitable award to the second place winner in each youth activity class provided the horse or rider has shown to 12 judges. Year-end awards are to be presented to high point amateur and novice amateur and a suitable award to the second place winner in each amateur class provided the horse or rider has shown to 12 judges. Year-end awards are to be presented to high point amateur select and a suitable award to the second place amateur select in each class, provided the horse or rider has shown to 12 judges.

High Point All age Awards will be presented to the High Point All age Halter Stallion, High Point All age Halter Mare, and High Point All age Halter Gelding with points earned from the open division halter classes. A year-end All-Around Open Champion award will be awarded to the horse winning the most points in halter classes and at least two performance classes during the year. At least 10 points must be won in each class (halter and each of the two performance classes). The performance classes count excluding the Youth Activity and Amateur Classes.

A WQHA Champion award will be awarded to each horse earning 200 WQHA points, with at least 50 points earned in halter classes, at least 50 points earned in one AQHA approved performance event, and at least 25 points in another AQHA approved performance event, excluding youth activity, amateur, and novice classes. Points earned in previous years will count toward this award. Only one WQHA 200 Point Champion award will be awarded to each horse. Effective January 1, 1988, points will not begin to accumulate until a horse becomes a yearling.

A WQHA Champion award will be awarded to each Amateur horse and rider combination earning 200 WQHA points in amateur classes, with at least 50 points in one AQHA amateur performance event. These points began to accumulate on January 1, 1989. Only one 200 point champion award will be awarded to each horse and rider combination.

A WQHA Champion award will be awarded to each Youth horse and rider combination earning 300 WQHA points in youth classes, with at least 50 points in one AQHA youth performance event. Only one 300 point champion award will be awarded to each horse and rider combination. Novice amateur and novice youth points do not transfer to their respective 200/300 point awards. Youth points do not transfer to amateur. Small Fry points do not transfer to Youth. Points will be compiled on a one horse—one youth basis in youth activity events, one horse-one amateur/amateur select in amateur events, and are to be awarded on the same basis used in the adult division.

Points are to be accumulated from the date of the postmark on the envelope in which the current year's dues are received by the membership chairman, or the date of the receipt issued by the membership chairman or his assistant. The membership chairman shall retain all envelopes for proof of dates.—Anyone making dues payments to someone other than the membership chairman does so at his or her own risk.

POINTS WILL BE AWARDED ONLY IN WQHA APPROVED SHOWS.

The WQHA will recognize with a suitable award certificate at the Annual Awards Banquet the following horses:

1. National High Point Stallion, Mare and Gelding in any halter or performance class earning this title in the current year and owned by a member of the WQHA.

2. AQHA Champion horses [open – amateur – youth] earning this title in the current year and owned by a member of the WQHA.

3. AQHA Superior horses in all Open, Amateur and Youth classes earning this title in the current year and owned by a member of the WQHA.

4. It will be the owner's responsibility to notify the Awards chairman prior to December 31 if his horse has earned any of these awards. A copy of the AQHA show record must accompany said notification. Special recognition for National Youth awards is the responsibility of the Wisconsin Quarter Horse Youth Association. *Updated February, 2016*





Article I

Name and Purpose

This organization shall be known as the Wisconsin Quarter Horse Association, Inc., hereinafter referred to in these bylaws as the Association. The Association shall at all times be operated and conducted as a not-forprofit corporation in accordance with the laws of the State of Wisconsin pertaining to such organizations and by which it will acquire such rights as granted to associations of this kind. The purpose of this association shall be to promote in all ways the interest of the American Quarter Horse; to increase the number of breeders, exhibitors, and pleasure riders; to advance all events in which American Quarter Horses are shown or raced; and to do any and all things necessary to advance general interest and knowledge of the American Quarter Horse in Wisconsin.

Article II

Relationship to Parent Organization

The Association shall aspire to be the official affiliate of AQHA. All proceedings of the Association shall be in harmony with the policies and activities of the American Quarter Horse Association.

Article III

Membership

Membership shall be open to an individual, family, partnership, farm, firm, or corporation within or outside the state of Wisconsin. Only Wisconsin residents may be elected to office. Members of the Association shall become subject to the rules and the bylaws then in force or later adopted by the Association, and shall be subject to disciplinary action by the Association as provided by these bylaws. A family membership shall include husband and wife, parent or legal guardian, and children 18 years of age and under. All members of the family and farm name, if any, must be designated. A single membership shall be open to persons of any age. Family, farm, partnership, and corporation memberships must designate on the membership application two (2) people to represent said memberships on voting matters. Annual membership categories shall include single, family, partnership, farm, firm, or corporation. A lifetime family membership shall also be available. All annual memberships expire on December 31st. Annual dues for continuing members are due and payable on January 1 of each year; all annual memberships become effective on the postmarked date of payment or actual date of transaction and are not retroactive. Dues shall be set and reviewed from time to time by the Board of Directors.

Article IV

Districts

The State of Wisconsin shall be divided into six (6) districts as follows: DISTRICT I shall consist of Ashland, Barron, Bayfield, Burnett, Chippewa, Clark, Douglas, Dunn, Eau Claire, Iron, Lincoln, Marathon, Oneida, Pepin, Peirce, Polk, Portage, Rusk, St. Croix, Sawyer, Taylor, Vilas, Washburn and Wood counties.

DISTRICT 2 shall consist of Brown, Door, Florence, Forest, Kewaunee, Langlade, Marinette, Menomonie, Oconto, Outagamie, Shawano, Waupaca and Winnebago counties. DISTRICT 3 shall consist of Calumet Fond du Lac, Manitowoc, Ozaukee, Sheboygan and Washington counties. DISTRICT 4 shall consist of Adams, Buffalo, Columbia, Crawford, Dodge, Green Lake, Jackson, Juneau, La Crosse, Marquette, Monroe, Richland, Sauk, Trempeleau, Vernon and Waushara counties. DISTRICT 5 shall consist of Dane, Grant, Green, Iowa, Jefferson,

LaFayette, and Rock counties.

DISTRICT 6 shall consist of Kenosha, Milwaukee, Racine, Walworth and Waukesha counties. Article V

Officers

The officers of the Association shall be President, Vice-President and Secretary. The President shall provide at all regular and special meetings and perform such other duties as are customary to the office of President. The Vice-President shall assume the duties of the President when he/she is absent from a meeting or is unable to act for other reasons. The Secretary shall perform the customary duties pertaining to such offices subject to the authority of the Board of Directors. The treasurer shall be appointed by the Board of Directors. The appointed treasurer shall have previous experience in accounting and shall be knowledgeable and familiar with accepted accounting procedures. The appointed treasurer will be a non-voting member of the Board of Directors and shall not be included when establishing a quorum.

Terms of Office

The President shall be elected for a two-year term; the other officers shall be elected for a one-year term. Article VI

Regional Vice-Presidents

The number of regional Vice-Presidents shall be three (3). One Vice-President shall be elected by the members residing in districts 1 and 2. One Vice-President shall be elected by the members residing in districts 3 and 4. One Vice-President shall be elected by the members residing in districts 5 and 6. Each Regional Vice-President shall assist the District Directors in his/her region, provide help with shows if requested, and see that the District Directors call meetings in October in the respective districts to nominate one of more candidates for District Director and one or more candidates for Regional

Vice-President to be placed on the ballot for the annual election.

Article VII

District Directors

Each district shall elect one or more persons to serve as District Directors in the ratio of one Director per 50 membership votes, i.e. one Director for 1-50 membership votes; 2 Directors for 51-100 membership votes; and 3 Directors for any number over 100 membership votes. The number of Directors representing each of the Wisconsin districts shall be determined by the total number of membership votes in each district on October 1st of the previous year. The duty of the District Director shall be to serve on the Board of Directors and vote on such matters as come before the Board. Each elected Director shall have the right to select an alternate from his/her district to attend and vote at meetings of the Board of Directors which the Director is unable to attend. In case of vacancy due to death, resignation, suspension, or a move from the district, The Board of Directors shall by a majority vote of the entire Board, elect a successor from the respective district to serve until the next regular annual meeting. Article VIII

National Directors

Candidates for National Director for the state of Wisconsin may be nominated by the Association membership for approval by the American Quarter Horse Association. The National Directors from Wisconsin and any honorary AQHA Vice-Presidents residing in Wisconsin may be asked to serve as voting members of the Board of Directors. In return for their voting privileges, their duties shall be:

 a) To consider any question brought to them by any member residing in the state and to willingly give their counsel and advice; b) To bring to the attention of the AQHA any question or problem which cannot be resolved by the state Board of Directors and follow through until resolution;

c) To update the WQHA Board of Directors at meetings held thru out the year. If unable to attend, a report shall be emailed to the Board prior to the meeting.

d) To report to the membership pertinent details of the AQHA annual convention. This report shall be published in the minutes of the Directors on the WQHA website. The responsibilities of the National Directors in the American Quarter Horse Association are outlined in the AQHA rule book. The Board of Directors may reimburse travel expenditures of the National Directors with prior approval.

When a vacancy occurs in the AQHA National Directorship for Wisconsin and due notification of the vacancy has been received from the AQHA, an election to establish a nominee from the state of Wisconsin to fill this vacancy shall be conducted. The nominations shall follow the process indicated in Article XI of the bylaws. The individual selected as the Wisconsin nominee in the voting process will be the candidate nominated by the WQHA to the AQHA nominating and credentials committee. The AQHA nominating and credentials committee will select the National Director from a list of candidates including the WQHA Nominee.

Article IX

Board of Directors

The Board of Directors shall consist of the elected Officers, the three Regional Vice-Presidents, the District Directors, the Immediate Past President, the National Directors, Directors-at-Large, Directors Emeritus and Honorary AQHA Vice-Presidents residing in Wisconsin. The general management of the Association shall be conducted by the Board of Directors. The term of office of the Board of Directors shall be one (1) year beginning January 1. Meetings of the Board shall be called by the president at such time as he/she feels is necessary. At least one meeting shall be called and convened every sixty (60) days. If the President does not call this meeting, it may be called by any five (5) Directors of the Board. Notice of meetings of the Board of Directors shall be given in a reasonable time to each Director by mail, telephone, fax or e-mail. Reasonable notice and the method of giving notice shall be determined by the President and the Secretary, keeping in mind the urgency of the business to be conducted. Location of the meeting shall be determined by the President. A majority of the Board (including alternates) shall constitute a quorum for conducting business. The ex-officio members of the Board (past president, National Directors, Directors-at-Large, Directors Emeritus, and Honorary AQHA Vice-Presidents) shall not be counted in the quorum but their votes shall count in the conduct of business. If any member of the Board of Directors misses three (3) consecutive meetings without a valid excuse or without sending an alternate, this Board member may be removed from office at the discretion of the Board of Directors, and a successor appointed by the Board to serve the remaining term of office. Any District Director or Regional Vice-President may be removed from office at any time by a majority vote of the members in his/her district or region at a meeting called for that purpose, provided at least a ten (10) day notice has been given in writing to each member of that district or region. An officer of this Association may be removed at any time by a majority vote of the

general membership attending a meeting called for that purpose, provided at least a ten (10) day notice has been given in writing to each member of the Association. The quorum for this action shall be that as defined in Article XIX Section 2 of these bylaws.

Article X

Executive Committee

The Executive Committee shall consist of the elected Officers and the Regional Vice-Presidents. Only one member of a family (husband, wife and children 18 years of age and under) may serve as a voting member of the Executive Committee at any time. The Executive Committee shall act of behalf of the Board to conduct the day-to-day business of the Association which does not require a full meeting of the board. Meetings of the Executive Committee shall be held at the discretion of the President as required to conduct the business of the Association. The agenda of the Executive Committee meetings shall be communicated to the Board of Directors one week prior to the meeting of the committee. Location of the meetings shall be determined by the President. A majority of the **Executive Committee shall constitute** a quorum for conducting business. Article XI

Elections

A nominating committee, consisting of the Regional Vice-Presidents, shall prepare a slate of nominees for officers of the Association. At district meetings held prior to the annual meeting, nominees shall be selected from the floor for the offices of District Director and Regional Vice-President. The nominating member must reside in the nominee's district or region. All nominees shall be presented at the annual meeting by the Elections Committee. The election of the Board of Directors (Officers, District Directions, Regional VicePresidents), and the confirmation of a National Director Nominee, shall be by mail ballot. Ballots shall be mailed within two (2) weeks of the annual meeting to all members in good standing of the Wisconsin Quarter Horse Association. There shall be space on the ballot for write-in candidates. Ballots shall include the date of the December Board of Directors meeting at which the votes will be validated.

Each member shall vote for all Officers and for the District Directors and Regional Vice-President from his/her respective district and region. A family, partnership, farm, firm or corporation membership shall be allowed two (2) votes; a single membership is allowed one (1) vote. All marked ballots shall be placed in a sealed envelope and received by the Election Committee at the designated address by the first Saturday of December. The Election Committee chairperson shall present the results of the voting at the December meeting of the Board of Directors. The Board shall consider any election challenges and shall validate election results. The decision of the board is final.

If at the close of nominations at the duly held annual meeting, there are no contested positions, the Executive Officer may call for a vote of acclimation from the floor, this vote will supersede the mailing of ballots and nominated officers and directors will stand as elected. This process will only be used in lieu of a ballot vote when there are no contested positions. If upon the close of nominations there are no contested races for Executive Committee Members, the chair may call for a vote of the members present to elect the Executive Committee and advise the elections committee to mail ballots to the respective districts with contested races for District Director.

Article XII Committees

Various committees and their chairpersons may be appointed by the president and approved by the Board to help conduct the business of the Association. Committee chairpersons may attend any meetings of the Board as non-voting members. Committee chairs are required to submit a prosed budget for approval by the Board of Directors. Committees are to submit a report for all Board of Director Meetings. All committees shall report to the Board on their activities and recommend policy changes to the Board. All expenditures beyond the budgeted amount for the committee must be approved by the Board prior to the expenditure. All financial transactions conducted by committees (i.e. disbursements and receivables) will be conducted through the office of the WQHA treasurer. Any member of a committee who fails to perform his/her duties may be removed from the committee by a two-thirds vote of the Executive Committee. Article XIII

Meetings

The annual meeting of the Association shall be held at a location and time determined by the President, not prior to the second Saturday in October, nor later than the second Saturday in November. Notice of the annual meeting shall be published in the calendar of events on the WQHA website, emailed and/or mailed. The annual awards banquet shall be held on a date approved by the Board of Directors. District members select nominees for district office. In addition to the annual meeting, a general membership meeting may be held in the spring if called by the Board of Directors with proper notice to the membership.

Special meetings may be called by the President or by any five (5) members of the Board of Directors with at least a ten (10) day written notice and an agenda indicating the purpose of the meeting. At all meetings of the Association, holders of a family, partnership, farm, firm or corporation membership shall be allowed two (2) votes provided the designated representatives are present; holders of a single membership shall be allowed one (1) vote. Proxy votes will be accepted for any member in good standing provided that the presiding officer has a signed statement authorizing the proxy vote. In the event that a quorum is not present for a Board of Directors meeting, members in attendance from a director's home district may be appointed by the presiding officer to proxy for that director provided that no district may be represented by more than their allotted votes. Article XIV

Employees

Some paid positions are necessary for the day-to-day operations of the Association. The Board of Directors shall review all applications for paid positions and hire applicants on a yearly basis by a majority vote. Applications for paid positions shall be submitted no later than October 30 of each year. Employee contracts shall run from January 1 through December 31 each year. Paid positions shall receive compensations including salary and office expenses as determined by the Board of Directors. All paid and unpaid positions shall submit a written monthly report for each Board of Directors meeting. All position, paid or unpaid, shall be required to turn over all hard copy and digital files to the WQHA Board of Directors upon request, annually upon completion of term, or upon resignation.

Article XV Disciplinary Action

Any person placed under disciplinary sanction by the American Quarter Horse Association, i.e. expulsion, suspension, etc. is automatically placed under sanction by the Association. Sanctions shall apply to all Association activities, i.e. show, futurities, etc., Disciplinary restrictions imposed by the Association shall conform to the restrictions imposed by the AQHA. The following acts and proof of their commission established to the satisfaction of the Board of Directors shall be sufficient grounds for suspension or expulsion of any member from the Wisconsin Quarter Horse Association: Not paying or giving a worthless check for entry fees, office charges, stall charges, stock charges, advertising payments and any other fees or debts delinguent over 90 days, provided that the members are provided with written notice by certified mail of the impending suspension. Board of Directors request for a hearing must be made in writing to the President within 15 days of receipt of the suspension notice. Any member is entitled to a fair and impartial public hearing to appeal a potential suspension or expulsion prior to a vote by the Board of Directors. Notification of suspension or expulsion shall be by certified mail, return receipt requested. A member suspended or expelled by this Association may be reinstated by a majority vote of the Board of Directors. Reinstatement following sanctions imposed by the AQHA shall require written proof of reinstatement by the AQHA and approval of the Executive Committee of the WQHA. Article XVI WQHA State Show

The annual Wisconsin Quarter Horse Association State Show shall be held as approved by the American Quarter Horse Association.

Article XVII

Fiscal Year

The fiscal year of the Association shall be from January 1 through December 31.

Article XVIII

Contracts

Written contracts of the Association shall be executed on behalf of the Association by the President, provided they are reviewed and approved by the Executive Committee and/or the Board of Directors.

Article XIX

Amendments

These bylaws may be amended in either of the following ways: 1) At any annual or general meeting of the Association by a majority vote of those present and voting provided that:

a) the amendment has been approved and recommended by a majority of the Board of Directors present at a properly convened meeting and b) all proposed amendments have been published on the WQHA website and/or emailed to the membership prior to the meeting at which they are to be voted on: or

2) At any annual or general meeting by three-fourths of the members present and voting provided there is a quorum of one-fourth of the membership from within the state of Wisconsin. A proxy (as defined in Article XIII) shall be counted toward the quorum.

Article XX

Dissolution of the Association

In the recent event that the Association is dissolved for any reason, the assets of the corporation shall be designated for the American Quarter Horse Youth Association Scholarship Fund. Updated at the October, 2016 WQHA Annual Meeting




