Find Your Level - Need help finding your AQHA show level? Follow these helpful steps.

- 1. Visit aqha.com/services/leveling to access the online level verification system.
- 2. Choose a division: amateur, open or youth.
- 3. Choose: exhibitor or horse.
- 4. Enter ID: membership ID for exhibitor or registration number for horse.
- 5. Select "2017" as the show year.
- 6. Click "Check."

Note: A Level 1 eligibility application must be filed each year, and all Level 1 exhibitors are encouraged to complete the Level 1 application and return it to AQHA as soon as possible. Previous Level 1 application information on file with AQHA

may conflict with current eligibility, which would affect the eligibility being shown on the level verification system.

Even if proven not liable, you could incur considerable legal defense costs. Ride Wisconsin is the WHC Trail Riding/Driving Award Program that is an annual selfsupporting program that awards riders/drivers for the hours spent enjoying the trails.

Annual Program membership is \$10. A current WHC Individual membership (\$20) or a current WHC Youth membership (free when a parent or guardian is a current WHC Individual member) is required to participate. If you are not a current WHC member, please send the membership form along with your Riding/Driving program membership form. Riding/Driving hours must be reported by January 31 of the following year using the approved Annual Log Form.
